

1. Observations of the candidates on the question papers of CA Final, Intermediate Foundation and Post Qualification Course - INTT-AT

ICAI has invited candidates of the May 2025 CA Final, Intermediate, Foundation, and INTT-AT exams to submit any observations on the question papers by 24th May 2025. Feedback can be sent via email to examfeedback@icai.in or by Speed Post to the Joint Secretary (Exams), ICAI, New Delhi. Submissions must include the candidate's name, registration number, roll number, email ID, and mobile number to be considered.

2. Eligibility requirements for applying September 2025 Chartered Accountants Final Examinations

The ICAI has released eligibility criteria for the September 2025 CA Final exams. Candidates must complete their 3-year articleship by 31st August 2025 or be in their final six months of training. Completion of Advanced ICITSS is mandatory, and qualifying specific Self-Paced Online Modules (Sets A-D) is required based on individual academic progress.

3. Eligibility requirements for applying January 2026 Chartered Accountants Final Examinations

The ICAI has released eligibility criteria for the January 2026 CA Final exams. Candidates must have completed their articleship training by 31st December 2025 or be in the final six months of training as of 1st January 2026. Completion of Advanced ICITSS is mandatory, and qualifying specific Self-Paced Online Modules (Sets A-D) is required based on individual academic progress.



A cluttered mind lacks clarity. It makes us lose track of our goals, feel disorganised, and struggle to stay motivated. It delays decision-making and creative thinking.


In contrast, a healthy mind brings clarity, helps us stay on track, enjoy the process, and ultimately perform better in exams, all while keeping our happiness intact.
