My Journey as a Chartered Accountant

Dear Fellow Professionals and Aspiring Chartered Accountants,

As I sit back and reflect on a career spanning over more than three decades, I am filled with a deep sense of gratitude and humility and contentment from the profession that I am continuing to serve even today. Coming from a modest background in Guwahati, my journey as a Chartered Accountant has been nothing short of transformative. The road has not always been smooth, but every challenge faced, every obstacle overcome, has shaped the professional I am today.



When I began my career, accounting was still largely manual, books of accounts were handwritten, calculations were double-checked, and filing meant stacks of physical papers stored in dusty cabinets.

ICAI Guwahati organises training programme for peer reviewers

GUWAHATI, April 3: The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has organised one day training programme for peer reviewers, said an official statement on Thursday.

The programme was organised by the Guwahati branch of ICAI under the aegis of Peer Review Board, where more than 50 senior CAs attended on the 3rd of April, 2025.

"From time to time, ICAI organises training for CAs who have at least 7 to 10 years' experience and empowers them as peer after they pass a test," the statement added.

chairperson of Guwahati Branch informed that peer review is being made compulsory by ICAI in phased manner for all CA firms for performing all kinds of audit and assurance functions.

"This training will facilitate more CAs to become reviewers and also to train firms to get themselves peer reviewed," he added.

On the other hand, CA Purushottam Lal Khandelwal came from Ahmedabad and he explained the rationale and growing importance of peer review in ensuring transparency, accountability, and adherence to professional standards in the auditing profession.

Later, CA (Dr.) Kamal Mour from Guwahati provided an in-depth understanding of peer review procedures, documentation, and reporting mechanisms, along with the importance of the Audit Quality Maturity Model (AQMM) in peer review compliance.

CA Amitesh Agarwal from Kolkata guided participants on adhering to ICAI's Technical & Professional Standards, Ethical Guidelines, and Audit Documentation requirements.
