BOS ANNOUNCEMENTS

Revised Code of Ethics (13th Edition)

The Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) has notified that the **Revised Code of Ethics (13th Edition)** comprising Volumes I, II, and III is effective from 1st April 2026, except for Serial No. (xxxi) relating to "Assessment and evaluation of Social Impact, CSR Impact, Business Responsibility and Sustainability Reporting, and the like", which has been effective since 11th December 2025.

The revised Code strengthens the ethical framework for Chartered Accountants and aligns domestic and international professional standards, including sustainability assurance and independence requirements.

The three volumes cover:

- **Volume I:** Domestic provisions under the Chartered Accountants Act, 1949, Regulations, Council Guidelines, and Decisions.
- **Volume II:** Convergence with the IESBA Code of Ethics 2024 Edition.
- **Volume III:** Ethics Standards for Sustainability Assurance, including independence standards.

Members and students are encouraged to familiarize themselves with the updated provisions and ensure compliance in professional practice.

ICAI Announces September/November 2026 Examination Schedule

ICAI has officially released the examination schedule for the September/November 2026 session.

The key dates are as follows:

- CA Intermediate – Group I: 1st, 3rd & 6th September 2026
- CA Intermediate – Group II: 8th, 10th & 12th September 2026
- CA Foundation: 2nd, 5th, 7th & 9th September 2026
- CA Final – Group I: 2nd, 4th & 6th November 2026
- CA Final – Group II: 9th, 11th & 13th November 2026



ACTIVITIES OF THE MONTH

Educational Visit to RBI

The Guwahati Branch of EICASA organized an Educational Visit to the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) on 6th May 2026, providing students with a unique opportunity to gain firsthand exposure to the functioning of India's central banking institution. The visit was coordinated by CA Member CA. Hardik Agarwal and saw the participation of approximately 50 students. During the visit, students were given an overview of the key operations of the RBI, including its role in monetary policy, currency management, and financial regulation. They had the opportunity to observe the currency processing and verification systems, the note sorting and destruction processes, and learned about the banking supervision framework. The visit also provided insights into the RBI's role in maintaining economic stability and financial inclusion in the country. The session proved to be highly enriching and informative, giving students a deeper appreciation of the regulatory and monetary architecture of India's financial system.



Industrial Visit to Genus Power



The Guwahati Branch of EICASA organized an Industrial Visit to Genus Power Infrastructures Ltd. on 9th May 2026, offering students a valuable hands-on exposure to industrial operations and manufacturing processes. The visit was coordinated by CA Members CA. Puja Dadech and CA. Ravi Bajoria, with approximately 50 students in attendance. During the visit, students were taken through the manufacturing floor where they observed the complete production process of energy meters – from raw material handling and component assembly to quality testing and final packaging. They gained an understanding of precision engineering, quality control mechanisms, and the role of technology in modern manufacturing.



The visit also provided students with practical insights into business operations, supply chain management, and how financial and cost accounting principles apply in a real industrial setting. The program concluded on an enriching note, bridging the gap between academic learning and industry practice.

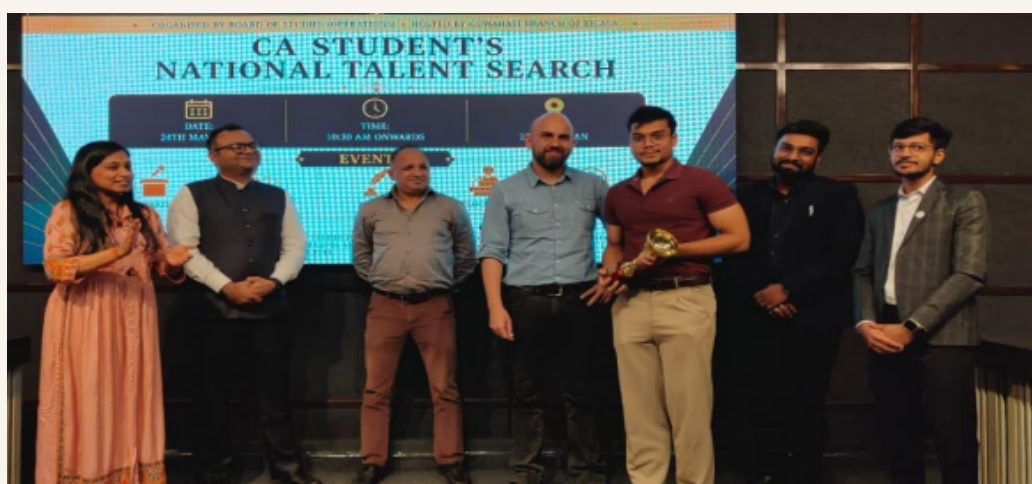


National Talent Search - Sketching Competition
